ROTARY CLUB OF SANTA CRUZ SUPPORTS FOUR AREA NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THROUGH GRANT PROGRAM

SANTA CRUZ, Calif. - Earlier this month, the Rotary Club of Santa Cruz Board of Directors awarded \$5,500 in grant funds to four area nonprofit organizations through its Benevolence and Grants Committee. Funded grant amounts ranged from \$1,000-\$2,000.

The list of recipients includes:

- BirchBark Foundation creates a safety net and provides veterinary services for struggling families who cannot afford critical veterinary care for their pets.
- Habitat for Humanity builds decent, affordable homes and provides home ownership opportunities to qualified families who live and work in Santa Cruz and Monterey Counties.
- St. Francis Catholic Kitchen provides food, clothing, shelter, and new opportunities to those in need.
- Vista Center empowers individuals who are blind or visually impaired to embrace life to the fullest through evaluation, counseling, education and training.
