ROTARY CLUB OF SANTA CRUZ HONORS VETERANS ON JULY FOURTH

SANTA CRUZ, Calif. - On July Fourth, two teams of volunteers from the Rotary Club of Santa Cruz went to work to honor local veterans at Oakwood Cemetery on Paul Sweet Road. The morning crew raised dozens of American flags at 7 a.m. and the afternoon crew (pictured) lowered and folded the flags at 3:30 p.m.

The Club shows its support by raising and lowering the flags several times of year, including Memorial Day, July Fourth, and Veterans Day. Each flag is stamped with the name, birth date, and death date of the veteran upon whose casket the flag had been draped. Their families provided the flags to be used for this purpose.
