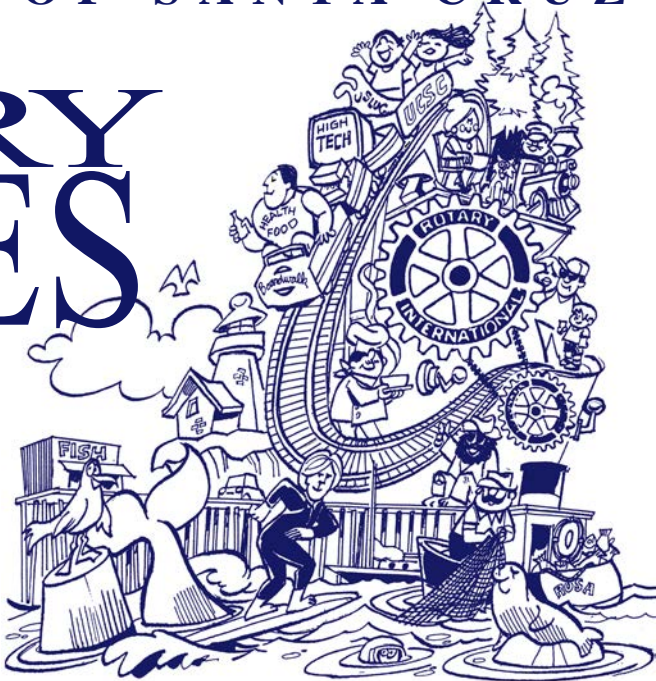

Prez Slatter in South Korea!!

Our new President Sid started off his new year with a great program. His mom came as a special guest. It is always nice when members bring their family and friends to Rotary.

Sid shared interesting stories from his trip to Seoul, South Korea, where he attended the Rotary International Conference (Sam Bishop said he was there and never saw Sid the whole time...Hmmm).

The conference took place at the KINTEX Center in Goyang, South Korea. It drew 44,000 registered participants from 150 countries. The Prime Minsters of South Korea and Sri Lanka greeted the body. President John Germ talked about how Rotary International operations can be run in a more cost effective fashion. Updates on projects involving Polio Eradication, Water Purification and disaster assistance were presented. The House of Friendship was alive and well and 75 Fellowships had information booths.

We saw slides of some of the magnificent palaces along with the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) and the Joint Security Area (JSA) that separate North and South Korea. This is where

the “cease fire agreement” was signed. He also talked about the so-called “Bridge of No Return” referring to the ultimatum that prisoners must choose between the country where they were captured or to return to their homeland but once they crossed the bridge they could never return. The last prisoners were exchanged on the bridge in 1968. The bridge stopped being used altogether after an incident in 1976 when two American Soldiers tried to trim a tree in the JSA that partially blocked the view of the United Nations when they were assaulted and killed with axes by North Koreans.

On a lighter note we learned that Churros come in all forms including peanut butter and squid (together). Apparently some see Churros as “better than a boyfriend”. Sid’s girlfriend, Meredith, accompanied Sid, so perhaps we can ask her. We also found out that after a battery of tests Sid was determined to be an Imagination Sommelier!!!

In the coming months we will hear more about Sid’s projects. He will be emphasizing youth and veterans. The donation given on behalf of our Speakers will be given to the Young Writers Program. This program gives 12th graders a chance to publish a book

and present their work publically. We will be getting more information on this amazing program.

We will also be looking closely at the veterans in our community and determining how our club can best assist them. We are also increasing our involvement with Rotartact and Interact.
