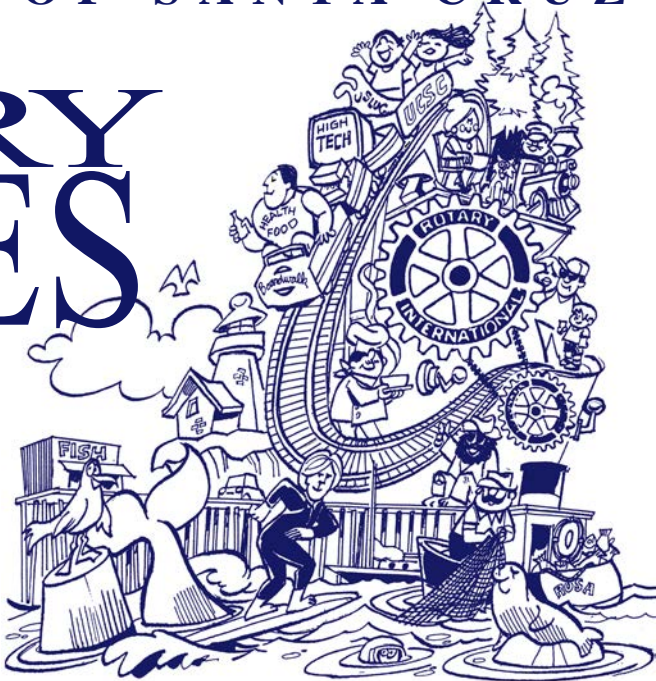

Peter enjoys surfing so much that he introduced his brother and his wife to the sport. Both of whom have become avid surfers. Peter's preference is to surf long waves and mostly alone. The next sport he highlighted is also a solitary sport. He

introduced us to paragliding. Peter really likes paragliding because it is very open and free. There is not a lot of machinery. You have ropes, a parachute, & nothing else. Paragliding is interesting because you have to learn to read airflow. He generally flies at 80 feet however he has gone as high as 1200 feet. The next sport was a melting pot of both surfing and paragliding. Kitesurfing is a sport that uses wind to move a surfboard. It is a way to harness the power of wind and surf many more waves. Peter really likes to surf a lot of waves. He also likes to feel the power of wind pulling on the kite. Peter has been able to reach 65 MPH and has been able to jump as high as 80 feet. He uses the speed and power to surf very large waves. He likened the activity to dancing in between mountains. Peter finished his presentation by noting that he is not a good swimmer but he is good at holding his breath.
