Detective: Fred Gawlick's detective



Program: The program was presented by **Sam Bishop**. He told us his tale of fly fishing for the world's largest freshwater scaled fish. The Arapaima is a freshwater fish that usually grows up to 7 feet in length and weighs 200lbs. The largest Arapaima ever recorded was over 15 feet long. Arapaima can breathe fresh air and do not need water to survive short periods on dry land. Due to overfishing, the Arapaima are endangered. Sam being an excellent Rotarian and even better fisherman wanted to save this fish which lives in Guyana. Guyana is an eco-state and rural. The fishing grounds are in a remote area. To get there he flew to Brazil. Then drove to Guyana on mostly dirt roads. Then took a small riverboat. He traveled up river for three days to Rewa lodge. There had been a drought so he to push his boat through shallow water. Guyana has otters that are 6 feet tall. Sam knows because he picked one up hitchhiking. Finally arrived at the

fishing grounds, Sam was greeted to the finest hammock where he slept for 15 days. While at the fishing grounds Sam caught freshwater Swordfish using bright flies, Red tail catfish, Matamata turtles using his toes, Aramama, Piara, and Peacock Bass. Every day at noon many sulfur butterflies would hatch, clouding the air. The fishing presented a unique obstacle. Piranhas inhabit the water. They have very sharp teeth and would destroy lures with one bite.
