

She discussed all the ways the Foundation helps Cabrillo students and our community, including Cabrillo's Veterans Information Center. They are most proud of their nursing program. The program features a unique solution to a nursing student challenge. Students have difficulty getting enough hours of live experience before getting their nursing diploma. Cabrillo has a live simulator that counts towards these hours. This way more nurses can hit the work force as we are facing a shortage in that field. Eileen brought Flor Chacon who is the Veterans Information Center Coordinator to discuss the support services provided to help veteran students succeed at Cabrillo College. Cabrillo has 144 veteran students currently enrolled in their programs. Most are majoring in business, computer science, and social science. Veterans are helped adjust to college life by Flor and her team.
