Detective Report:

Peter Cook was our detective and he had a really funny report related to "group tweeting". Excellent job Peter!

Program:

Donna Maurillo filled in for Kim Adamson to introduce our speaker, Hon. Rod Diridon. She said it was a real honor to introduce Rod because she worked for him for 9 years. She introduced him as the "Father of Rail in Silicon Valley".

Mr. Diridon was very adamant that "Climate Change is Real". The Mineta Transportation Institute as well as virtually every legitimate research institute has solid data validating the earth is heating up at an accelerated rate. The Bay Area News Group reported that since 1940 the planet's heat has increased and the last 3 years were the hottest 3 years in recorded history.

What is causing global warming? Transportation is 38% of the cause, Industry 20% and residential 6%. We need to get people out of petroleum vehicles and into electric transportation.

He spoke about how far the USA lags behind the rest of the world in high speed rail. There are 30 different HSR systems in the world and not one in the United States. Japan has 1500 miles of HSR and their trains travel at 220 mph. Other countries with HSR include: Korea, Taiwan, China, France, Italy, Spain, Turkey, and Russia. California is the only state in the United States constructing a HSR. 5 Billion dollars in contracts have been signed for Phase 1. There will be 790 miles of HSR with 26 stations. San Francisco to San Jose HSR will be finished by 2025 and Gilroy will become a major hub for the area.



On a positive note, since it has taken us so long to get a HSR moving forward in California we will be able to learn from everyone else. We will have the best system in the world and the best train cars in the world.
