Program:

Our program was the Santa Cruz Museum of Natural History and our speakers were Ami Davis, Development

Manager and JM Brown, Community Relations Manager for the museum.



Ami spoke about several of the changes that have occurred with the Museum including that they have a beautiful new sign and that the museum is no longer a part of the City of Santa Cruz but rather their own 501(3)(c). And that the City of Santa Cruz still owns the building but the Museum rents the building for \$1.00 per year.

Beginning April 8th and running through June 18th there will be a new temporary exhibit called “the Art of Nature” with many wonderful artists’ works.

In the Fall, they will have an exhibit by the legendary Frank Perry titled “Natural Bridges”.

The museum has lots of “hands on” activities for kids such as their pelt station and the dig pit where kids dig for, and find fossils.

They have also done some public programming including a lecture at the Rio Theater presented by Dr. Gary Griggs. And they plan on doing more of these kinds of informational events.

They have teamed up with the Coastal Watershed and will be doing some walks along the San Lorenzo River where they will be looking at all of the beautiful birds who inhabit this area.

The mission of the museum is: to connect people to nature and inspire stewardship of the natural world through an array of educational programs and exhibits focused on natural and cultural history of our region.

In 1905, Laura Hecox who was the lighthouse keeper opened the first natural history museum and in 1950 the Santa Cruz Natural History Museum moved to its current location.

Currently, the museum has 16,000 objects in its inventory. In 1982, the City of Santa Cruz put the Whale in at Tyrrell Park next to the museum and it has been an iconic connection to the museum ever since.

Currently the museum has 16 staff members (some are part time) as well as over 60 volunteers.
