The speaker last week, Mike Naumann, a Rotarian from Sacramento club, leads Asian region YoungLife. He gave us some YL history (founded, 1941, in Texas) with some of the oldest clubs in the bay area, 60 years old. This editor remembers YL in Santa Cruz 48 years ago. And some of us in the room remember personal times at YL camps in our youth.

Sacramento Rotary club service project is English literacy in Nepal. The club has over 300 members. Each year he leads a group to Pokera, Nepal via Katmandu. They feel that even though English is spoken in India, in Nepal, English is only available to the privileged. So their group avails themselves to (high school) students, in (classroom settings, or YoungLife club settings?) where they converse in English, as English speakers, not English teachers. The Rotary club partners with YoungLife, because the faith based organization has good people and a working system in place at locations around the world. Nepal being one, where they feel the need is strong for English literacy. Their global grant value is about \$75,000 which pays for curriculum and teacher training. Volunteers pay \$5500 for the experience, and if you are interested , their next trip is planned for November.
