Ed Durkee was detective and his theme was, "You know you are in Santa Cruz, when ...". Stoney Brook added this terrific comment, "You know you are in the City when you dial 911 and a blue uniform cop arrives shortly. You know you are in the County when you dial 911 and no one shows up." Ed warned us that someday we may have \$200 fines like they have in Salinas. I hope not, Ed.

The speakers, Val Cole and Jacob Martinez, shared the floor to speak to us about Digital Nest. Val is a volunteer and vice chairman of the board DN, Jacob is the head of DN, and was the Santa Cruz entrepreneur of the year, 2015. This editor hadn't heard of DN, so all of this information was new. I was amazed to hear all about the program. Jacob talked about the inception of the idea for DN when he saw a student doing his homework outside of a building so that he could access wi-fi. He saw that there was a need for coworking space for the youth in

Watsonville. They have taken over 4500 sq. ft. at the old post office and have the second fastest internet in Watsonville (Cruzio). It's open 7 hours everyday of the year. The members, ages 12 to 24, have all the services available to them for free. The site encourages co-working skills and self starting skills. The mentors help with programming skills, resume writing and the youth have opportunities to be placed in internships. The Nest gives the students tools and opportunities for tech success. How is their success measured? Eight of the students are full time employees. College admissions have shown good results at film schools and CSUMB. Forty-three members are paid for their services as mentors. There are 1200 members, 40% female. 82% Latino. Last year their annual budget was \$700,000 and this year \$1,000,000. Val and Jacob encourage any of us to come visit the facility and even encourage us to volunteer to be mentors.

Last Week's Program

Last weeks program was 'dark' because of the District Conference. Those of us who attended were exposed to the wonderful district community. I was fortunate enough to be at the Saturday breakfast program. The current RI president could not attend our conference and we were honored with the presence of Richard King (RI president 2000-2001). Past president King has been a

member of the Niles/Fremont club since 1968. He has spoken in 130 countries and his speaking style has all the elements of a perfect presentation. He offered friendly advice to our local clubs, "Keep things light, but don't make a joke of everything". He complimented district 5170 as being the best district in the world. Thirty five years ago our district was the first district to reach the \$500,000 mark to the Rotary Foundation. He told a perfect joke that had elements of suspense, character development and an innocent child, with an overtone of self-deprecation ending in a funny plot twist. Rick offered thoughtful insight when our membership struggles with making donations to the global efforts of Rotary when also wanting to fund local programs. His perspective to see the solution is found in the club's name, Rotary International. The world is our neighborhood and in that regard makes Rotary club unique.

Rick also included an inspirational story drawn from his personal experience. While in Plymouth England, he met a Rotarian troubled over the recent death of his son and found it hard to deal with that loss and to continue with his dedication to Rotary. Through Rick's quiet counseling the gentleman decided to make a contribution in his son's name. Three years later Rick found that the gentleman was proudly involved in the district governor's conference.

Russ Hobbs and Hung Wei (Cupertino) received the Karl Stucki award for their greatest contributions to Rotary ideals.

Friday night was the Richard D King speech contest at the Monterey Bay Sanctuary. Fortunately, it was well attended. But unfortunately, the fire marshal's recommendation for the room was for 68 people, so ... SRO. I had to go a wedding Saturday so I couldn't go to all of the forums or the dinner Saturday. But I was glad to attend the youth focus forum. I was proud to hear Avalon Althouse will be an outbound exchange student to Belgium.
