Speaker Introduction:

Mike Splain, is executive director of Santa Cruz-based nonprofit, Ventana Wilderness Alliance. The VWA began as an advocacy group in 1998, scored a major victory when it helped federally protect 50,000 acres in the Ventana and Silver Peak wilderness areas. Mike began volunteering with the Ventana Wilderness Alliance in May of 2003. He became a part-time staff member in July, 2008 and was promoted to full-time Executive Director in April of 2012. A native of Maryland, Mike relocated to California in 1991 and has since pursued wild lands conservation as a supporter, volunteer or staff member for various advocacy organizations, including Forests Forever, Sierra Club and the California Native Plant Society. Mike holds a BS in Ecology and **Evolutionary Biology from UC** Santa Cruz and currently serves as Wilderness Chair of the Sierra Club, Ventana Chapter.

Last Week's Program

Hello all. The editor is currently absent, but last week I remember that Peter Cook provided the Raffle prize, promoting Bantam Restaurant, won by my chauffeur, Wally Dale. Our June exempt personality is Aleene Althouse. Announcements blended with detective notes. Slatter construction takes a bow for the Boardwalk job, and noted they had nothing to do with the post ponement of Abbot Square opening. Everyone is always happy to see Gary Reece and John Peterson join us. Tom Canfield was Happy to launch the 100 days of Summer. Keith McKenzie was thankful for the

continuation of his vision care/ cataract surgery in Guatemala, by our guest speaker, Dr. Martin Fishman, and for the dedication of Jim Zenner and his Water Warriors.

Guatemala, with a population of 16 million, has the highest birth rate and 77th highest infant mortality. The median age is 22. Since 1996, volunteer ophthalmologists, nurses, and operating room staff have treated medical eye disease and performed laser and cataract surgery at the Clinica Maxena in Santo Tomas Union, Guatemala. This is a poor agricultural region, hours from the nearest city with better hospitals. Much of the population is indigenous people, many who do not speak Spanish. 66% of blindness is due to cataracts, and 75% of blindness is treatable. The first three years (combined) the clinic treated 450 patients and performed 70 surgeries. Every year, the community looks forward to the arrival of the 'Seeing Again Guatemala' group. Now they see nearly 1000 patients in the week and perform 50 cataract

surgeries. Tax deductible donations are used for medical and surgical supplies and equipment. Eighty percent of the supplies are donated. The volunteers pay for their individual airfare, room and board, and transportation. Their next trip is in October, and there are not many jobs for other volunteers.
