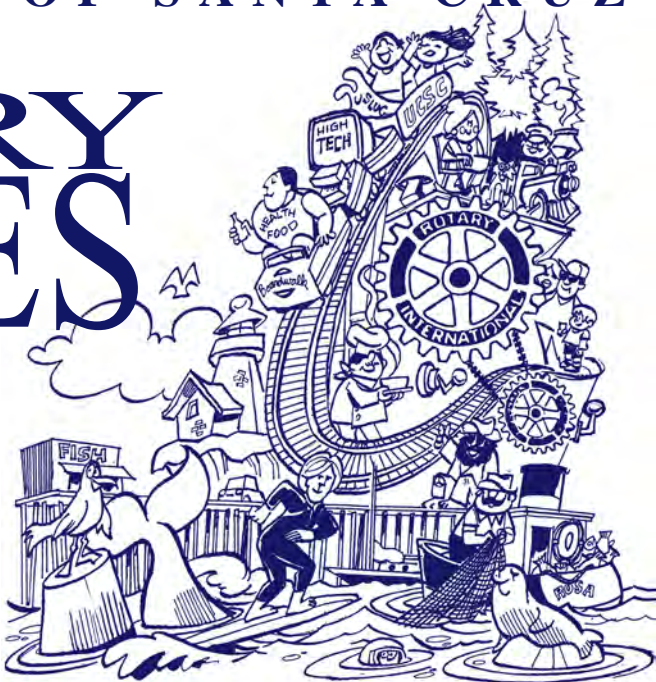

The 1969 oil well blowout and spill in the Santa Barbara Channel was the seminal event that led to a ban on oil drilling off the coast of California, and later on created the Monterey Bay Sanctuary, and ultimately the Sanctuary Exploration Center here in Santa Cruz.



Guest Speaker Chelsea Prindle manages the education programs and overall operation of the Sanctuary Exploration Center where she teaches people about the special qualities of the Monterey Bay.

Its offshore canyon presents environmentalists, marine biologists,geologists, and others with the

deepest near-shore water environment in the world.

This amazing ocean resource hosts a more diverse habitat than anywhere else, and its marine wildlife and flora is also the most concentrated anywhere. It hosts a very large variety of Charismatic Megafauna. *(If you’re wondering, that means “very cute animal life.”)*



Besides their teaching duties, the 5 part-time staff members and 63 volunteers at the Center help create policy and do maintenance chores. Like our club they do beach cleanup, they have lobbied for policies such as banning cruise ships from calling in Monterey and worked with farm organizations to control what chemicals go into the soil.
