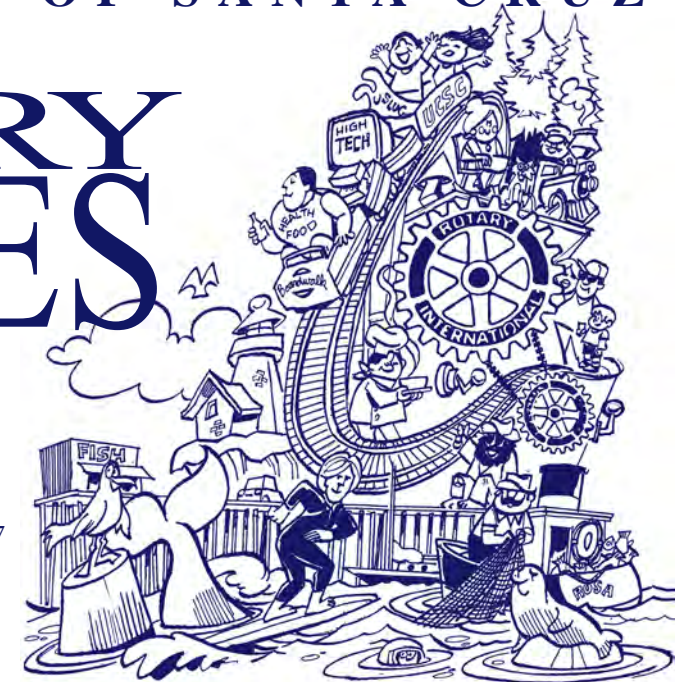

Long-Term Care Is Complicated And Very Expensive

Her 35 years in the long-term care business, including nursing home and Medicaid facility administration, insurance sales and administration, has led Barbara to one very important conclusion: Long-term care is best done at home.

Annie Asche announced District 5170 2018 Flash Campaign to fund End Polio Now raised almost \$2,000 and continues until the end of the month with a 2:1 match from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

But that may not be the best financial or life style alternative in any one family’s situation. Home care requires another family member to be the caregiver and that is a significant time commitment, especially if the caregiver is working full time. Often the caregiver has to give up working to take

care of the family member in need.

The insurance and government programs that can pay for professional care are many, very complicated, and often quite expensive. Barbara’s business is often focused on helping families figure out what

program will best serve their needs and what is required to enroll in them and stay in them.



Part of the complexity comes from the range of care that may be needed. Some 70% of Americans will require long-term care but the range goes from help dressing and bathing after surgery to full-time skilled nursing facility or nursing home residence.

Only 1 in 10 people have long-term care insurance and, while Medicare, Medicaid, and state and local programs, can make up for that, strategizing one’s way through the options and requirements is complicated. And each program covers different things for different levels and types of needs.

And there is a health cost to the family as well. Studies show, for example, that caregivers of Alzheimer’s victims have a higher risk of early death.
