# **Sheriff Jim Hart**

"I'm not against the Second Amendment"

Sheriff Hart began with an overview of the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Department, reviewing its 365 employees, new headquarters, and new jail which is the first equipped to accommodate the County's new status as a state prison site.



Then the Sheriff moved into a serious discussion about gun violence that started with his statement that he is "appalled" by the level of gun violence here in the County and across California and the country. "There has to be something done about it," he said, "but I'm not against the Second Amendment or anything like that."

The Sheriff cited national and local statistics. For example, in California there have been 16,366 shootings since 2014 that resulted in 5,543 deaths, 7,544 injuries, and 922 children shot or killed.

Gun ownership in the United States is the highest per capita in the world with 90 guns for every 100 people. Most countries outlaw automatic and semi-automatic weapons, but they are legal in ever state here. The highest density of gun violence

incidents is in the coastal areas where population and population densities are the highest.

Mass shootings, in which there are 4 or



more victims, are on the rise. There were 270 in 2014, and 346 in 2017. Hart said that while most people stand on one side or the other of the gun regulation debate,

there is wide agreement on so-called common-sense issues such as universal background checks and preventing people on no-fly and similar watchlists from buying guns.

Even California's gun laws aren't enough and so Santa Cruz County has undertaken many steps to deal with the problem including confiscation of guns from people prohibited to own them, a very successful gun buyback program, home and business safety inspections, gang enforcement, and strong penalties for gun violence. The county is also supporting the proposed AB-3 legislation that prohibits all gun purchases until age 21.

The problem, according to Sheriff Hart, is leadership. "I really thought things would change after the Sandy Hook massacre of 22 kindergarten children," said Hart. But, he recounted, no nationwide legislation has been passed. "I think we're better than this."
