Vanessa Silverstein & Cathy Conway Advance Directives

Most people think they are a good idea but don't actually create one.

Besides providing hospice services and counselling, Hospice of Santa Cruz County educates our community about advanced directives, the documents that tell families, medical providers and caregivers what our end-of-life wishes are.



The big issue is having "that difficult conversation" that nobody, not even doctors, wants to have. Surveys show that 90% of people say that the conversation is important, but only 27% of people have had one with their family or doctor.

Jim Zenner announced installation of another solar water purification plant in storm-ravaged rural Puerto Rico, where most of the population remains without electrical power or clean water. Less than one third of doctors have training in advanced directives, and less than one third have a system in place for creating and monitoring them. Cathy Conway said many doctors don't even realize that Medicare pays for the office visit to have that conversation.

Hospice of Santa Cruz County's Advance Directive outreach program seeks to "normalize" the conversation. About 70% of attending Rotarians have created one.



Common reasons to not have the conversation and create the advanced directive are few but important. People

don't want to take the time, families don't agree on the objectives or process, and it's difficult to tell when the time is "right" for the conversation. Conway also said it's important to keep the advanced directive updated to reflect changing family situations.

Cathy Conway and Vanessa Silverstein will give advance directive presentations and training to any interested group, large or small. They also train doctors and other medical professionals on how to have the conversation with their patients.
