Dr. Laina Farhat-Holzman

Saudi Arabia is One Strange Place

Saudi Arabia is the only country in the world named for its founding family (the Sauds), and Middle East expert Dr. Laina Farhat-Holzman delivered a fascinating talk on the current struggle to modernize this ancient Islamic kingdom.



The Sauds were Wahabi sect Islamists who won out over rivals in other sects to control the territory in 1930 following years of battle. The Saud family has ruled ever since and today the kingdom is ruled by Mohammad Bin Salman Al Saud, popularly known around the world as MBS.

While his most famous action was locking his political rivals in "jail" (actually the local Hilton), his important work is an ongoing effort to modernize his kingdom. That is no



small task as religious leaders have become wealthy under earlier regimes and do not want to give up their well-paying authority.

But MBS has made progress, particularly in his effort to liberate women from the constraints imposed by Islam. For example, women can now drive automobiles and attend athletic events, although they are still required to wear their traditional garb including the face-covering hijab and sit in segregated sections at sports arenas.

Progress is slow. Women can become professionals but can only serve women. The Religious police are quick to punish rules violators and women are often beaten for their offense.

Water Warrior Jim Zenner announced next year's District Designated Funds will fund a water purification system in Bonanza, Nicaragua, an impoverished gold mining town that uses its one stream for water intake and outflow.

In the Middle East generally older rulers are aging out and younger ones such as MBS are moving in with modern ideas gleaned from time spent being educated in American and other Western universities.

Another factor that will be at play is that Saudi Arabians have money to buy whatever they want, but when the money runs out they will be forced to modernize.
