The State of the City



Santa Cruz City Manager and fellow Rotarian Martin Bernal began his report on the state of the city by citing the three areas of focus in the current strategic plan:

Housing – the tight market has driven the cost of housing up and while there are no longer state-supplied redevelopment funds to help with construction of new low-cost housing major projects are underway to build more than 600 new housing units in the downtown area which are expected to relieve some of the supply and pricing pressure.

Public Safety & Well-Being — Dealing with the large homeless population in the city is a major strain on city resources and took up most of Martin's presentation time. The homeless population continues to grow both here and across the state and country.

Issues around the problem include mental health, substance abuse, a lack of accountability and lack of adequate health and human services for these people. The city has developed a managed campground on River Street and is focused on creating

other temporary sites. A major need is providing a new year-round, permanent center to house the homeless.

When asked if the rest of the county is pulling its weight, Martin said, "County seats such as Santa Cruz are always the focus for these populations because that's where facilities are located." Meanwhile, the city is working with the county to find satisfactory regional solutions.



President-Elect Wes Walker presented CASA's Cynthia Druley with a check for \$32,310, the amount raised in 5 minutes for the Fund-a-Need auction at the Rotary Roundup. CASA has raised an equivalent amount for a total of \$64,620.

Infrastructure – The city infrastructure is aging, so the city is working with Cruzio to provide fiberoptic for internet transmission, and planning a new library and a new farmers market with more adequate parking.

Fiscal Stability – The Measure S sales tax increase will help despite declining sales tax revenues due to higher online sales. Meanwhile, the CALPERS pension fund is experiencing low growth which puts pressure on the city to increase its contribution to the pension plan.
