Bay Area Hyperbarics
Lisa St. John, M.S.



Lisa St. John, M.S. and her staff have performed over 60,000 hyperbaric treatments over 20 years. Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) is a medical treatment which enhances the body's natural healing process by inhalation of 100% oxygen in a total body chamber, where atmospheric pressure is increased and controlled. It is used for a wide variety of treatments usually as a part of an overall medical care plan. Lisa is a pioneer in the HBOT space, and her clinic is the longest running in the country. Lisa earned her Master's degree from Harvard University and completed a Fellowship at Stanford University.

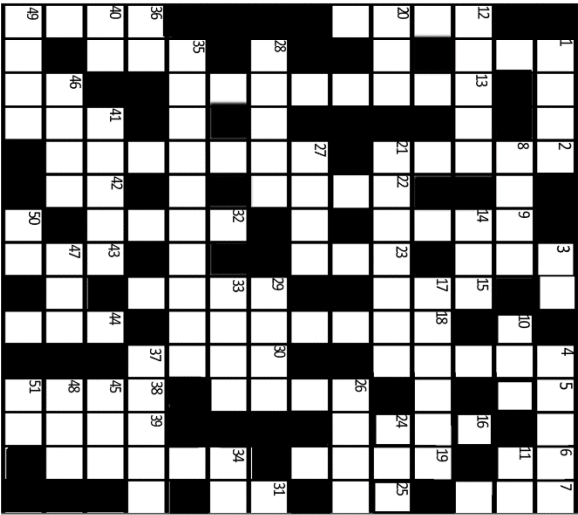
