

# Dwight Lowery Soquel High's NFL Star

When Santa Cruz native Dwight Lowery transferred to Soquel High School he was playing basketball, but after watching the football team practice he thought, "These folks could use my help." Countered fellow Soquel High alum Tom Castillo, "Actually, we just plain stunk."

That began Dwight's football career which has now come full circle. Today he is head football coach of the Soquel High Knights, and the journey between tenures at Soquel included many twists and turns that started with playing football at Cabrillo College, then transferring to San Jose State where he was an all-star for two years in a row.



Dwight was drafted into the NFL by the New York Jets. "New York was different," he says, "and I was a young man working with grown men who really knew what they were doing." His NFL career went on for 9 seasons, that included playing for several teams -- the Jaguars, Chargers, Falcons, and others. "I had 10 head coaches in those 9 seasons," said Dwight, "which had its good, and its bad, points." After he was cut from the Chargers he had an opportunity to play for the Buffalo Bills. "After a lot of thought, I turned it down," he said, "I just didn't want to be there." Something about the weather, perhaps?



Dwight came back to his home turf in Santa Cruz where he talked with people about working with young people. He was asked to take on the head football coaching job at Soquel by the basketball coach there.

"It's not just about football," says Dwight, "it's an opportunity to help these kids grow and create goals for themselves that they can work at." The job gives Dwight a chance to teach the life lessons he learned as he grew in his career. "And besides," he says, "I'm having a lot of fun with it because of camaraderie with great kids and staff there."
