The Crisis in Affordable Housing

Don't listen very hard when a politician says, "I will work on affordable housing."



Former State Assemblyman and Santa Cruz County Supervisor Fred Keely started with the crucial facts that November 1978 saw the passage of California Proposition 13, which set in stone how property taxes are calculated, and Santa Cruz County Measure J which limited our growth and our ability to receive funds from the state.

The state proposition dramatically reduced county tax revenues, the county measure limited how much money the county would get from the state and, according to Keely, that combination, along with state laws mandating housing growth, have severely impacted the county's ability to develop affordable housing.

Adding to the problem, Silicon Valley has continued to grow apace, and the entire financial mix has caused housing prices to increase dramatically, further limiting the availability of housing at all levels, but especially affordable housing.

Keely doesn't shirk his own responsibility in this, having been a State Assemblyman during the passage of measures that limited the county's ability to develop housing, but he also thinks not enough has been or is being done to correct the trends.

"Are we really trying?" asked Keely, "it seems to me there has been a lot of thinking and planning, but very little doing."

As one measure, during the last 40 years Santa Cruz County has built one unit of affordable housing per month while state mandates require 50 per year. Keely is skeptical of UCSC's ability do its share by building enough housing for its student load. "We should demand that UC take greater responsibility."

New leadership in the legislature could help by paying more attention to areas like Santa Cruz. "We are only 1% of the population, so get only 1% of the money," says Keely.

He suggests that the county could use the tools that are there more effectively, and that no one should listen very hard when a politician says, "I will work on affordable housing." Does that include Fred?
