Rotarians @ Work Purifying Water, Preventing Polio in India

60 cents worth of polio vaccine can immunize a child for life against the crippling disease. In 1979, 150 countries were dealing with polio and today, thanks to Rotary's EndPolioNow program and the Gates Foundation, there are just three.



Rotarians Janet Gluch and Jim Zenner recently travelled to sections of Agra in India in January with Rotarians from other clubs to administer the vaccine, and to install a SunSpring solar-powered water purification system at Shamshabad.

EndPolioNow

Pledge cards on tables at last week's meeting generated almost \$2,700. The Gates Foundation will match that 2:1, and the match is available until April.

So, keep on giving!

Acceptance of the vaccine was made easier by local Rotarians who explained the program and its benefits ahead of their visit, so by the time Janet, Jim and Jim's wife Pauline got to work there were seemingly endless lines of people lined up to have their children vaccinated. Janet said 3,000 vaccines were administered in one day.

Jim was also busy installing the new water purification system with the help of club members from Districts 5170 and 5170, and local Rotarians who shoved and heaved the 1,000-lb crates of equipment into place.

The projects are related – polio is waterborne and only 20% of people living where polio still exists use toilets. That combined with drawing water from shallow wells helps to propagate diseases of all types. Most people drink only bottled water.

Preparation for the SunSpring installation in Shamshabad included drilling a 300-foot deep well to provide water that could more easily be purified by the new system.



Jim Zenner has already developed his proposal for DDF funds for a SunSpring purification system in Guatemala next year. "You are all Water Warriors," said Jim as he cited the various roles of club members that add to support for water projects. "And pledge cards for contributions to EndPolioNow are on the table and we're grateful to those who fill them out," added Janet.
