Career Technical Education Santa Cruz City High Schools

Counsellor Sheri Williams and BioTech teacher Nehal Pfieffer, along with Superintendent and Rotary host Kris Munro, talked about the extensive Career Technical Education (CTE) program that has a goal of graduating good citizens able to go right to work or get further education to pursue their career goals.



There are currently more than 1,700 students in the program. "It's designed to change their trajectory and ensure their career future, while improving their academic performance" said Sheri.

Academic levels go up because the skills students learn make subjects like math and writing relevant and useful.

EndPolioNow

Pledge cards on tables at last week's meeting generated almost \$2,700. The Gates Foundation will match that 2:1, and the match is available until April.

So, keep on giving!

Currently 95% of students in the program graduate high school and 78% enroll in further education for their careers. Until

2015 the program was funded by the County Office of Education but now gets Measure O funds.

The list of programs offered in the CTE program includes Arts, Media, and Entertainment; Building and Construction Trades; Manufacturing and Product Development; Software and Systems Development; Auto Systems, Diagnosis, Service and Repair; Health, Science & Medical Technology; Culinary Arts; Criminal Justice; and many more.



Nehal noted that even the most advanced biotechnology companies need techs to run their labs.

Most programs have clubs that students attend in addition to classes, and many have advisory boards drawn from professional ranks. Some offer job shadowing where students can be with a professional and observe the work they do, and others are coordinated with technical education programs at Cabrillo College.

The curricula are designed to prepare students for college or career readiness. "Our goal is to produce the next generation of our work force," said Sheri.
