Foster helped her with a real estate exchange. Our detective who has seen many women flash him, has only seen two Rotarians sleeping at our exciting meetings. Those two people are Dan "sleepy time" Aldrich and Jim "night night" Courtright.



Program: Stoney "pathway" Brooke who is an alum of the marine core and the FBI national academy spent 30 years as a peace officer. This background gives him unique insight into good practices for handling veterans that find themselves in criminal difficulty. Stoney explained that veterans struggle with addiction and PTSD. Most veterans are jailed for trauma from their active service and the addictions that result from treatment. The Veterans treatment court helps veterans regain their dignity and find footing in our society. Stoney explained that our local court was operational in 2015 and has proven to be 95% effective in helping veterans avoid jail time and begin a peer led treatment program. In some communities benefits for veterans are in silos and it proves difficult for veterans to navigate and get the help they need. Santa Cruz has a unique situation in that the team that needs to act cohesively: the Santa Cruz County District Attorney, Public Defender, and Judge are all former service members. By the numbers the program has referred 206 cases, is currently working on 23 active court cases, has 93 graduates, and placed 16 veterans in peer support treatment.
