<u>Last Week's Program – Robert Freeman:</u> <u>One Dollar For Life (ODFL)</u>

While teaching at Los Altos High, Robert asked his students if they could make a difference by donating just \$1. To prove it, he promised to build a school in Africa with the proceeds. Pretty soon, 1,770 students had contributed over \$1,800. Robert was floored. He *had* to make good on his promise. So, he went to a few more high schools and raised enough money to build a school in Naro Moru, Kenya. It was then that One Dollar for Life ("ODFL") was born.

Since then, ODFL has built 14 classrooms in Nicaragua. 12 birthing centers in Nepal, 106 Latrines in Indonesia, upgraded 22 preschools in South Africa, and distributed thousands of "girls equality project kits"

Why does it work? According to Robert, people crave meaning in their lives, and ODLF provides an easy, inexpensive, engaging, impactful and transparent way of providing that. These small infrastructure projects have enormous positive impact on these communities.
