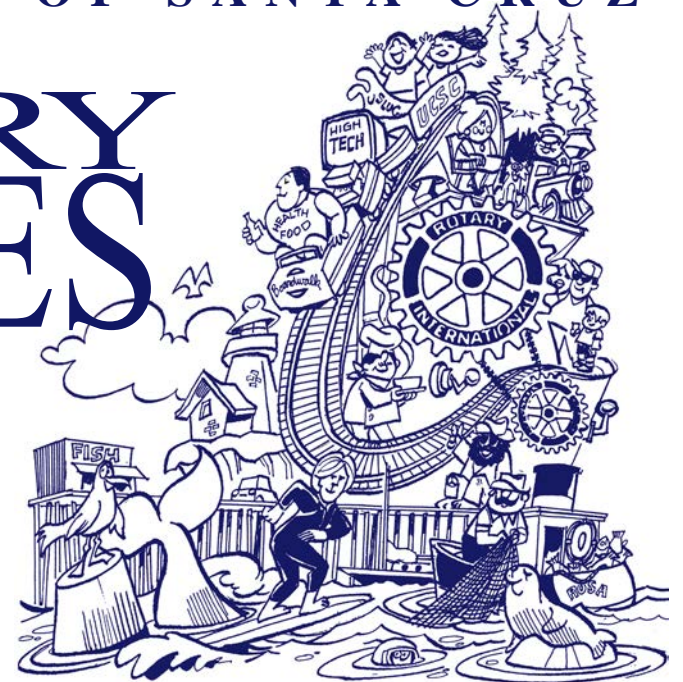

Last Week's Program – Kathy McKenzie: Voices of Monterey Bay



Who: Kathy McKenzie, disenchanted with the direction of print media, started hearing about the idea of "not for profit" journalism.

What: The not for Profit, Voices of Monterey Bay (VOMB), which focuses on local stories and stories with an element of social justice.

When: Kathy co-founded VOMB in 2017 with three other journalists.

Where: Hybrid Online & Print: VOMB prints less often to save costs. Print is intended to compliment the online product.

Why: Newspapers are shrinking (literally). They're smaller, with fewer reporters and resources. Advertising revenue has declined in newsprint, primarily because classified ads are no longer generating the revenue they once were. As a result, the quality of reporting has declined drastically.
