Mike Allard led us with inspiring words when it comes to being social. He shared: people with stronger social relationships had a 50% increased likelhood of survival over a given period of time than those with weaker connections. Those w/ a stronger network also had a 29% lower risk of heart disease, 32% lower risk of stroke and 47% lower risk of developing diabetes. In closing: "So while you're all here to support the fight against polio, purify water in Guatamala, etc., I am simply here for my health.";)

John Bargetto shared info about the Bargetto Winery, now celebrating 90 years. The winery started in December 1933, just six months after the Great Depression was at its worst. John noted that the US wasn't always a wine consuming nation, it wasn't until 1967 that the consumption of table wines surpassed the consumption of dessert wines.

In 1976 American wines started growing in popularity thanks to the 1976 wine competition termed the "Judgment of Paris," when California wine defeated French wine in a blind taste test. A movie telling this story was later created in 2008 called "Bottle Shock."

Bargetto Winery is a 30K case winery that has been at it for quite some time. They love to feature the arts, live music and events. The local community's support has been important to the winery's success. He then shared a proverb in Italian, which when translated means: "A barrel of wine creates more miracles than a church full of saints."
