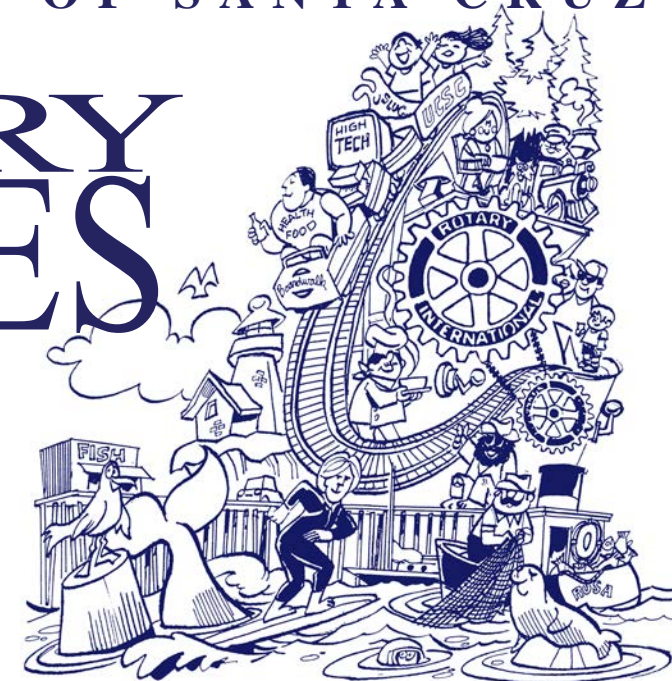

Last Meeting March 31, 2023

Aleene “Ace” Althouse shared words of wisdom inspired by nature and a quote from Theodore Roosevelt. She noted that Spring was in the air, Earth Day is almost here and with that provided an important reminder to be thoughtful and protective when it comes to our

wilderness and our wildlife as “There is a delight in the hardy life of the open.”

The **day's detective was Traci Bliss**, she started with a request for happy dollars. Annie said she's happy for a referral from Sharon and Traci gave nod to an upcoming Earth Day event.

From there it was a trivia day, the theme Cabrillo College in relation to our Club. Traci opened by reading their mission statement and then provided the rules: if you were right, you pick 2 people to pay \$5, if you're wrong you pay. Questions asked included scholarships, college choices and more. Participants included Ashley, John, Val, Jim, Janet and many others!

Then it was time for our guest presenters to take the stage, we heard from both **Matt Wetstein and Adam Spickler** representing Cabrillo College.

Matt kicked things off by asking who had been impacted by Cabrillo to stand up - whether you took a class, your family attended, etc. Nearly everyone in the room stood up.

He then provided an update on a grant the college recently submitted to help with a housing project. They are currently 7th out of 21 applications submitted. He shared the concepts and location, apartment layouts and that if the grant comes through, they'd hope to have the housing built by 2026.

Adam then shared information about the college's name change. He discussed the process including the creation of a task force, development of principle and hosting community forums. After all of this, the board took a vote this past fall and voted in favor of a name change. They are now working on phase 2.

They surveyed 1,500 people who provided more than 250 recommended new names. Some of which were suggested included Aptos College, Bay View Community College, Coastal College, Santa Cruz Community College and many others. He noted that the new name would not recognize a person, but likely a place or something

else. A recommended list of names will be brought to the public this June.
