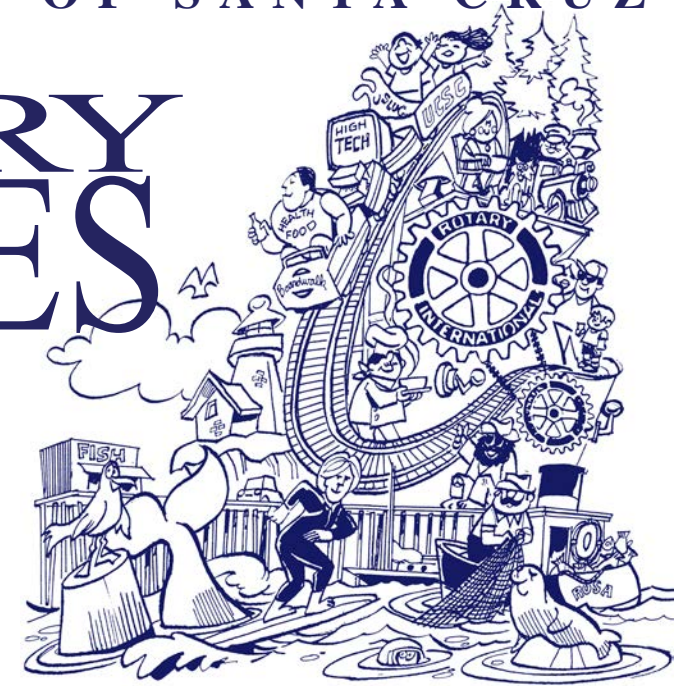

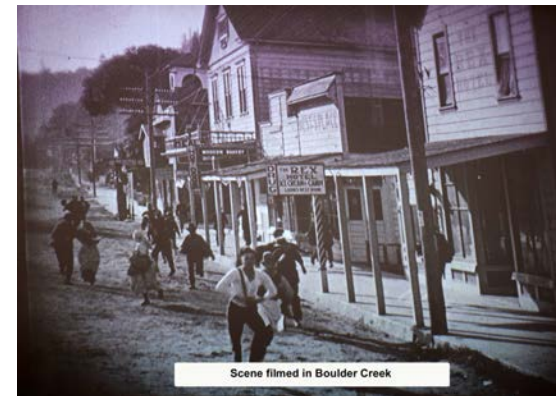
From there it was on to some **Taste of Italy Trivia** where Rotarians were tested on their knowledge of the upcoming fundraiser. Topics included details on the food, location, planned music and more. If you haven't picked up a pair of tickets, there's still time. James Mockoski, a film archivist with local ties, was our presenter. He started

out by noting that he had received a bond from our club many years ago and is still grateful for it. His story starts at UCSC where he had great professors at Cabrillo and developed an interest in film. He wasn't interested in production, but its history.

He wrote a letter to Francis Ford Coppola and Francis invited him to his first start in film restoration.

One film he worked was "Mothers of Men," a film that told the story of suffrage in the U.S. The film was made before women had the right to vote and was set in Santa Cruz.



This brought him to his next restoration for the 1926 film "The Johnstown Flood." The movie (also filmed in Santa Cruz) featured events that happened in 1889 where barons on the east coast wanted to build a resort town. And while they were warned about the nearby dam that needed to be fixed, they built

up the resort. Eventually, the dam broke and 2,000 lives were lost.

James walked us through scenes from the movie and compared them to where they would be located today. Locations included downtown Boulder Creek, Soquel Avenue and others. Films like these are a legacy of what life was like here during the past.
