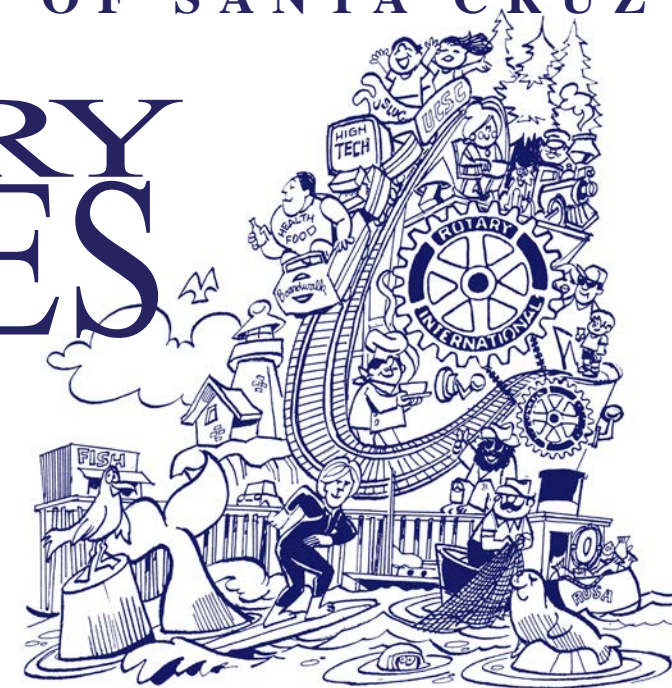

In the announcements, Russ Hobbs received his Paul Harris Society award from President Erik. Paul Harris Society became an official Rotary program in 2013 and recognizes members who contribute \$1,000 annually to The Rotary Foundation.



Joel Miller announced a showing of the mobile shower run by the AFCSC (Association of Faith Communities of Santa Cruz) at the Kaiser Arena. The shower will be there for the public to see on May 1st from 11am to 3pm. Our club contributed through our Benevolence and Grants program toward support for the shower program which has provided over 21,000 showers to people in need here in Santa Cruz.
