Last Meeting May 5th, 2023

Sam & Michael opened with God Bless America and Steve Karon offered a thought for the day about the diversity and world-wide reach of 1.2 million Rotary members in 46,000 clubs. Bob Bosso provided the Raffle gift which was won by David Terrazas.

Annie Asche served ast Detective (again) and did a great job on Cinco De Mayo trivia. The best bit of information for me was about how Mexican Americans know Cinco De Mayo as a purely American celebration (sort of like St. Patty's Day). The program showcased the work done by Mountains 2 Sea, with Brian and Jamey King offering a very good slide presentation detailing their work with local continuation high school students M2S works with students who need support in dealing with: Social Anxiety, Depression, Gender Dysphoria, Anger Management, Drug Addiction, Loss of a parent or guardian, and general lack of parental support. . M2S serves 80 students each year with a 12 week, one day each week, off-campus outdoor activities program. The focus is to bring the students into natural settings without access to any technology. There are 10 students in each session and hopefully the program will help the student participants build trust and skills in interacting with the other students in their group.

"MTNS2SEA has taught me to not hold on to things that have hurt me in the past, but to instead look forward to the opportunities that arise in the future. I also learned to believe in myself and trust that I have the tools to make my situation better."

The other goal beyond interaction and trust, is to give students a safe place to open up about their own troubles and insecurities and allow others to open up with them. Students build compassion for others and learn to love themselves through the experience. M2S has a three year plan to expand and offer services to more students. Brian estimated there are about 1,400 students in need of their services right here in Santa Cruz County.

Brian and Jamey fielded many questions and stayed around to chat after the meeting. They have a real passion for their work.
