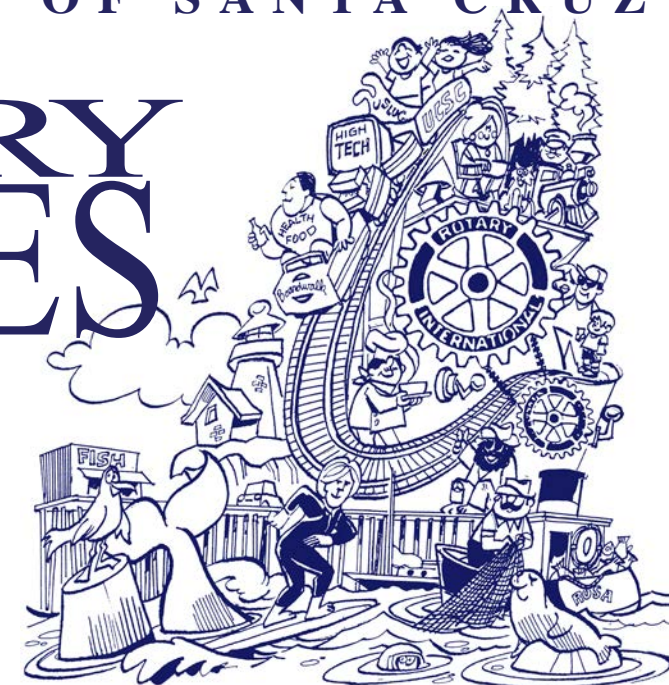

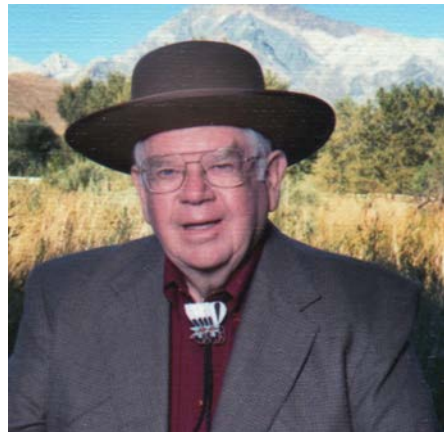

Program - Slowing Down at the Seymour Center: Jonathan Hicken

The Seymour Center started organically by community members walking by the original marine lab tanks behind the fence and asking what is going on back there? That curiosity spawned the now Seymour Discovery Center.

The center features safe touch pools for touching sharks, sea stars and many youth programs/field trips. They also hold a summer camp called Ocean Explorers where kids interact with the dolphins! To date they've had more than 1M visitors.

Jonathan shared a personal story about slowing down. He became a dad in 2019, the pandemic hit, he started new job in 2021 and then became a single dad. At that time he realized he needed to slow down.

When molecules speed up, they heat up. He imagined the earth and the 8 billion creatures moving around rapidly, "heating up" our environment. The need to slow down is more prevalent today than other.

As such, a new Climate Action Lab will be launched at Seymour Center this fall. It will show us a possibility for the future - how we can come together to solve the issues we are facing with the environment. It will be an exhibit of hope.

They will also build a wave tank to make waves and insert different barriers to show how the wave changes when that happens.

The Climate Action Lab is inviting everyone to slow down! Come visit!
