Detective Report by Kasey Hinchman:

Kasey's theme was travel. He talked about people, he paid their fines, he fined people, he made them tell travel stories.

Speaker was Chief Bernie Escalante from our Santa Cruz Police Department.

Chief was born and raised in Santa Cruz. He swam in our Elks Lodge pool because his father was an Elks Member! He has 27 years of service with the SC Police Department. He is honored to serve the community he grew up in.

Chief believes in discipline and boundaries. He thinks the criminal justice system lacks consequences and accountability and we enable behavior. It makes the job of the police extremely difficult. Decriminalization, deinstitutionalization, and defunding IS A PROBLEM.

Chief also wants to improve quality of life in our city. But, these issues are very difficult to tackle. Chief has Downtown Safety as a top priority. He wants people to go downtown and enjoy themselves and not fear for their safety.

The Police Department has had staffing challenges and they are trending in a better direction now. Issue is they are only 74% staffed. It is a difficult profession to recruit and retain.

However, the current team does an amazing job. These young professionals handle themselves very well.

Police work closely with County Mental Health professionals to address the needs of citizens. But, they are severely underprepared for those who are experiencing a mental health crisis. Especially, for minors. There are no resources for these people = a problem.

Only one homicide in the last two years. Most issues are substance abuse, mental health, and homelessness. Law enforcement are the first ones to respond and they don't have the tools for it.

How can we help? Pay attention when you vote. It matters.

Chief thanked us for what we do for our community. He is inspired by us!
