Every year the program grows. They now have a kitchen and serve food, which really enhances the audience experience. Santa Cruz Shakespeare is building a new building this year, getting a new artistic director, and a new managing director.

Their goal is to make live, classic theater relevant to students in this day and age. Santa Cruz Shakespeare achieves this goal by inviting middle and high school students to attend a matinee show in the summer.

This year, Santa Cruz Shakespeare put on three productions: A Book of Will (non-Shakespeare), Taming of the Shrew (a Shakespeare comedy), and King Lear (a Shakespeare tragedy). Go see one! There are still a few tickets left and a couple weeks left in the season.
