New member, Tom Moran, received his red badge today. He is sponsored by Jim Zenner. He came from Rotary in San Francisco.

Detective Report by Fred Gawlick.

He said he asked for guidance and mentorship from Erik and this detective report would be a continuation of the detective report from last week. He showed an old picture of Colleen Harrison, Bob Ciapponi, and Blaine Brokaw. He said he wasn't going to actively fine anyone. Rather, giving money today during the detective report is voluntary. Fred brought evidence to counteract the program that Ashley did last week. Fred investigated and found out that there are approximately 25 interactors at Harbor High and there are community service projects in the works. He just couldn't tell us what they were...Then, Fred showed some "football porn" (these are Mike Allard's words): there were a bunch of buff men taking off their shirts and bro-ing out in a State Farm commercial. Fred moved on to "asking Rotarians to think" about what they are passionate about in

Rotary or "for each other". Donna Maurillo said she has been in this club for over 30 years because she doesn't know anyone that does more good or is crazier. David Terrazas got up and talked about how "kind" Mike Allard is and asked him to put in some happy dollars. Tom Parker gave appreciation to Fred for all the "stuff" he does in the community and in Rotary.

Speaker: Robert Oatey, the Fire Chief for the Santa Cruz Fire Department. Robert is Matt Falconer's "brother". Oatey said he is really happy though that he is not blood related to Matt Iol. Oatev has been the fire chief for the past 2.5 years. He is honored to serve in the community that he grew up in. They have four stations in Santa Cruise. The boundaries are Pasatiempo, yacht harbor, and out to the county line. They are the busiest department in the county. They have over 150 employees, but most are seasonal lifequards. They have around 60 full-time fire fighters. They do fire, hazmat, medical, and water rescue. Their department started in 1894. They have four departments under the Marine Safety Division: beach lifeguard service, marine rescue unit, fire enginebased rescue swimmers, and jet skis. Oatey created a program called "Know Before You Go!" to help citizens be safe in the ocean because we had 3 drownings within 5 days in the Fall of 2021. Rip currents are the third highest cause of water related death. They kill

more people than tornados and hurricanes. So, Oatev has created a place for the public to go and get information about conditions on the beach so they can try and prevent drownings in the future. They put the QR Code for this Watchtower Dashboard on the beach shuttle. lifeguard towers, lifeguard vehicles, and the local hotels are handing out this info. Oatev has created videos that warn people about the dangers of the local ocean. The Public Service Announcement videos they've created address: marine wildlife, rip currents, and cold water hazards.
