President Angelo announced that the Benevolence and Grants committee is meeting next week to review applications and decide on the recipients for the 3rd quarter. Their approved FY budget is \$24,600. For the second quarter they awarded \$6,500. There is \$12,600 remaining in the budget for Q3 & Q4. One of the recipients, the O'Neill Sea Odyssey is giving us the opportunity to attend a classroom facility project for a joint work party with our club and Sunrise club on 3/21. Detective Report: Jeanette Pagliaro.

Happy Dollars were shared by Chris Murphy, Mike Allard and Ian Mackenzie. Being a wine lover herself, Jeanette tested our knowledge of wine with a game of vino trivia. Fines were paid. Did you know that the most widely planted grape in the world is Cabernet Sauvignon and that a cork from a Champagne bottle can fly out at up to 50 MPH, or that Champagne gets its bubbles while it is in the bottle as the carbon dioxide dissolves in the wine creating the signature bubbles?

Program Speaker:

Ed Reiskin, Chief Financial Officer & Vice Chancellor was our speaker. He started working at UCSC a year ago, after serving more than two decades in local government. Ee's responsibilities include Budget, Finance, Facilities, Procurement,

Safety, Transportation, Human Resources, and Sustainability.

He reviewed California's Master Plan for Higher Education that was created in 1960 giving the University of California, California State University and California Community College systems defined roles.

UCSC was found in 1965 with foundational values of social & environmental justice. sustababilitym education opportunity and access and equality. Of the 19.000 students, 90% are from California, UCSC is a very affordable University and enrolls ~700 undergrads from the Monterey Bay region. The University has strong relationsips with Cabrillo, Hartnell and SJ City colleges and other community colleges to assist transfer students. UCSC faculty do research that matters: including the Center for Coastal Climate Resilience that leverages campus research identifying climate change solutions that can benefit people worldwide, UCSC's genomics team recently released the first truly complete sequence of a human genome and pangernome. The James Webb Space Telescope has allowed UCSC astronomers to redefine the outer limits of our galaxy. They are developing CT-scan technology that can better diagnose brain issues.

The UC long range development plan will increase enrollment and student/employee housing in stages. The campus is unique with more forest and open space than most campuses. They plan to use existing developed footprint in their planning efforts,

while keeping open space. The univeristy realizes that the campus can only grow enrollment by increasing housing due to limited housing options in Santa Cruz.

UC Santa Cruz creates a lot of jobs for Santa Cruz County.
