## Meeting:

President Donna welcomed some special Interact guests to our meeting. Colin Mackenzie, Club President, Ruben Torres, Club Vice President, Cathy Durden, Club Secretary and Steven Au, Club Treasurer all who are attending Harbor High School. We also welcomed Oliver Borg, Lt. Governor Interact District 5170 who attends Santa Cruz High School.

Jan Derecho and Cynthia Kilian did a

beautiful job as song leaders for our "Welcome Song".

Jack Ritchey won the raffle prize donated by Ross Condit. The prize included a special Pinot Noir bottled by Ross which was 17.4% alcohol (oh my). There was also a gift certificate to Gabriella's Restaurant and 2 tickets to the movies.

We were given a brief presentation from our RYLA attendees: Colin Mackenzie and Ruben Torres. Colin told us that at RYLA they all received buttons that contained "Action Reminders". He said these are really helpful to remind him what to do when he is having a challenging time. Ruben Torres said that he loved RYLA and what an amazing bonding experience and made some really good friends. Not just locally but with many people in our District. They both gave a big "thank you" to our club for sending them to RYLA.

President Donna announced that the "Rotarian of the Month" sign is missing. She apologized to Blaine and said she hoped it will show up soon.

## **Program:**

Blaine introduced our speaker Bill Tysseling who was raised in Ames, Iowa. Bill holds a BA in Economics and a law degree from the University of Iowa. In 2007 he became the Executive Director of the Santa Cruz Chamber. Bill spoke about the World Economy as something we don't understand and makes us uncomfortable. He said that a vision is really important and we don't really have one. We need to be thinking about a 5-10 year vision not a 2 year vision. "We can't solve individual problems without thinking about the larger economy".

He thinks that at the national/international economic level that robotics will replace workers. He used a couple of examples such as field workers who thin out lettuce, eventually strawberry pickers and Radiologists. The question is "how low will wages need to go to not be replaced by robots". We will buy products and goods directly from providers, i.e. clothing, travel arrangements.

He said that workers under 35 will have had 12 different jobs. People will be contractors and paid for a service they perform rather than being employed by a company.

In Santa Cruz we need UCSC to play a vital role. We need to create housing for our work force (contractors) and provide good transportation. Shopping will be in neighborhoods rather than malls. For us to be successful, we will need to focus on 3 things: 1) Response to land costs based on our proximity to

the Silicon Valley, 2) Water, and 3) K-12 education.

He announced that a group of Santa Cruzans (government, business, education, etc.) will be going to Santa Barbara on September 4-6 to discuss water, transportation and education.
