## **Last Week's Statistics:**

## Meeting:

The raffle prize provided by Matt Shelton was won by Jim Bargetto. It contained a gift certificate to Café Gabriella and a bottle of Cabernet.

There were a couple of announcements: Elizabeth Clifton said that they need volunteers to help with the "Farm to Fork" event at UCSC. We supported this event last year and it was a great event. She had sign up sheets on the tables. Wes Walker reminded everyone that our club BBQ is on Friday, September 12<sup>th</sup> at the Boardwalk. Everyone please sign up. It should be a lot of fun!

## Program:

We had a program change from Conquering the Iron Man Triathalon to the La Bahia Hotel Project.

Our speaker was Craig French who is a property developer and manager. He owns French Resources Group and one of his clients is the Seaside Company. They asked him to come up with a new team and to move the La Bahia project forward working closely with Carl Rice, CFO for the Seaside Company (and grandson of our own Bud Rice).

The current application represents the 3<sup>rd</sup> application in 11 years. This new project is a different project than the last project rejected by the Coastal Commission.

The new project is a 165 room, full

service hotel on the corner of Beach Street, Main Street and First Street. The building has been designed by a firm in San Francisco who designed Cavallo Point in San Francisco. The features of the hotel will include: 165 spacious rooms, with over 80% capturing views of Monterey Bay. The Five-star amenities include a pool, day spa, terraces and landscaped courtyards. There are 210 on-site, below-grade parking spaces and 4,350 square feet of meeting and banquet space, plus full service public restaurant and retail.

The previous project proposed tearing down the whole old structure. The new project preserves the historic bell tower.

Some of the community benefits of the new project are: A new 5 star conference hotel; provides construction jobs for two years; once completed, additional 200 jobs; provides \$750,000 in property tax revenue; and generates approximately \$1.4 million per year in transient occupancy tax (TOT) for our City.

The project is currently about mid-way through the process. The Planning Commission approved the project 5-0. The Historic Preservation Commission approved the project 4-2. The next step is to present the project to the Santa Cruz City Council on September 9th at 7:00. If approved by the Council, there still is an opportunity for someone

to appeal the project to the Coastal Commission which could delay the project for an additional 6 months.

If you are in favor of the project, it would be very helpful if you could show up to the Council Meeting on September 9<sup>th</sup> and let the Council see your support.
