Her favorite project was "Pearls with Purpose" which provides training to woman in Cambodia and the Philippines in jewelry making. They then sell the jewelry to get out of poverty and to pay for the education of their children.

After the convention, they continued their trip to Melbourne where they saw lots of beautiful birds and they fed kangaroos and dingoes.
