Last Meeting

It was a summer like day with a foggy and cool morning followed by an afternoon’s warmth. Inside the bar the sports junkies were buzzing with excitement and anticipation over World Cup soccer, 1st place Giants and A’s baseball, US Open golf, French Open tennis, the latest named SF 49er felon, the shark less hockey playoffs, the upcoming NBA finals, the just completed 505 international Monterey Bay races and who might be manly enough to go body surfing without a wet suit in the bay. Michael Harrington was going solo today on guitar. Fred Galwick, Donna Maurillo, Bob Bosso, Lynn Kundsén, Karen Beeson, Janet Gulch and Larry Fogelquist were my tablemates. Michael accompanied us in God Bless America and our welcome song as we

sang off key and out of synch. Peter Cook’s recent 40th birthday was cause for another celebration when he won Russ Hobbs raffle gift. Elizabeth Clifton gave a thoughtful invocation. Duf Fischer won the exempt drawing. President Frank honored the Bob’s, Bosso and Rudolf for bringing in a new member and for contributing \$1000. Then Joel Miller started his sermon from Mount Podium by fining himself for taking his badge home, then for Calgary’s 150th birthday and his children leaving home. His daughter was graduating from Cal Poly to Ireland and his 26 year old son got a job from Marv Jensen so he so he could move out of their house. Joel then offered us table games of “body, soul and spirit” which somehow ended in jokes like Leona who lost in the 200 yd breaststroke. “I don’t want to say nothing bad but those other girls were using their arms.” Or “A cucumber and a carrot get into an accident. The carrot will be okay, but the cucumber is a vegetable.” Larry Wallerstein introduced our speaker SC Port Director Lisa Ekers who told us the lower harbor started in 1964, with the upper completed in 1973. There is a waiting list of 1000 names for slips with a wait time of 2-30 years. It is 100% user fee funded. The 2011 tsunami lasted only 36 hours, but caused over 22 million dollars in damages to the harbor. 15 boats sank and 12 were destroyed. 30 docks were damaged and 23 were destroyed. There was no loss of life, but

they had to call in extra law enforcement and closed access to the Seabright area and harbor. It was standing room only by the harbor as people flocked in to see the power of a tsunami, which rushed water in and out of the harbor carrying boats, debris and docks with it. She said, “The drought is making more people come to the harbor and beach instead of the lakes.” 300,000 cubic yards of sand are dredged out of the harbor each year, which is the size of a 14-story football field filled with sand. Santa Clara 49ers stadium pales in comparison. In 1964 sardines died in the harbor and as I remember produced some powerful odors that were so strong paint peeled off nearby houses. Stupid kids like us got sardine slime on our sandals and feet that wouldn’t come off. This year whales and seals chased anchovies into the harbor where seagulls and pelicans feasted. As a sign of the times the port had to close the “combat fishing” area because drug dealers were selling fish for cash to buy drugs. Ever thoughtful of our closing time Frank brought the meeting to an end.
