Meeting: Everyone sang "God Bless America" in their usual off-key tone, so nobody qualified for America's Got Talent. We had ribs for lunch. Program: Our speaker was Diana Reyes Baughman, although her PowerPoint said her name was Diane Cox Reyes. So pick your favorite. As a representative of Chevron, she was listed as one of the most influential Latinas in the US. She told us that 6,000 products contain petroleum-

based ingredients. And we don't know whether to be happy or sad that gas prices are low. It means that the price of a barrel of crude oil is very low because Iraq and Arabia have flooded the market. But it also means the refineries will reduce production because it isn't profitable enough.

She also said there isn't much financial incentive for renewable energy at this point, so it won't be a major part of our energy in the foreseeable future. But we will have 9 billion people in the world by 2035, so fossil fuels will be about 65% of energy consumption at that time. The biggest demand for gasoline in the US was in 2007, but demand is growing in Asia because more people are buying cars. So it looks like Chevron will be in business for a long time.
