Today's Speaker, **Stoney Brook,** is a former Rotarian and 2X Paul Harris Fellow. Retired peace officer (30 years): Santa Cruz Sheriff's Office and District Attorney Criminal Inspector, Chief of Police West Valley-Mission College District, Chief of Security Seaside Company. Currently, Licensed Private Investigator, Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Policy Consultant, Coordinator for Santa Cruz County Veterans Treatment Court Program.

Jim Zenner was pinch hitting for Donna last week. His theme, "Sow the seeds of love" from 2002-3. Jim took a personal approach to the introductions of guests. He suggested he was rusty, but I disagree, he was fresh as always, and definitely not mothballed. The winning ticket, 869017, he annunciated clearly, so Bruce Dunn could hear and win Sharon's gift bag. **Wally Walker** had given Bruce that ticket.

Tom Honig was our detective last week, and his theme was based on his impending marriage. He asked several of us to share thoughts on marriage and got some thoughtful advise, and heaped the buckets full. Three very important phrases, suggests **John Burroughs**, "I love you," "You are beautiful," and "I stand corrected."

Last Week's Program: Rail Transit, Santa Cruz Regional

Transportation Commission. Why Rail, we ask? George Dondero, Executive

Director, and Karena Pushnik, Sr. Transportation Planner, presented highlights of the 175 page commission's report on the passenger rail. Travel patterns change over time, and they see cars ownership as an option. They also predict 37,000 more people living in our county in 20 years. The Rail would improve *connectivity* (sounds like Nina Simon). They left summaries on our tables. We are all encouraged to read the report and complete a 10 minute survey, on line, www.sccrtc.org/rail .The report discusses options to the plan, such as number of stations, length (mileage) of service coverage, and frequency of trips. Forecasts of ridership are estimates of how busy the various stations/stops would be. One estimate is the Bay St. (UCSC) stop would serve 1200 boardings per day. Feasibility studies are based on those assumptions. The results of the online survey are to be incorporated into their final report. Survey period ends July 31. Act now, so the report will reflect the community's input.

A positive aspect of the rail line is that it could/would connect to the Pajaro Junction Amtrak station, which in turn could connect you to the Diridon Station in San Jose. From there you can connect to the Capitol Corridor, Cal Train, and someday, BART, and high speed rail. And someday there may be a tunnel under San Jose from Berryessa to Diridon and Santa Clara.

This reporter liked the idea of a smaller, quieter, articulated vehicle,

as opposed to full sized engines pulling bilevel coaches. This is the early phases of a project whose goal is to be operational in ten years.
