

These were the dog days of President Frank's last few weeks. After doing a great job he would soon pass the gavel to the incoming President. Questions abounded! Would we continue supplying our guest speakers with chocolates or would we take a detour and offer cooking recipes instead? Would we continue giving a generous gift to Cabrillo Stage or would the Cabrillo Culinary institue be gaining favor? This transition was in full swing behind the scenes. Rotarians were being recruited for next year's key positions by the incoming Senior Direrctors with some major and minor arm twisting. Sam Bishop led us in a rousing rendtion of God Bless America. Jim Zenner's invocation continued that theme by blessing us and thanking God.

Michael Harrington thanked Elizabeth Clifton for blessing him with a raffle prize of Giant's tickets to a 9/11 game. Pete Huemer went from Red to Blue Badge. Sharon passed out Bummer Beach Rotarian hats to the Cowell Beach neat freaks of Fred, Cynthia, Larry, Russ, Hank, John and me.

Grant Dow was our red badge detective and our Friday the 13th nightmare. He tried to make us believe that football was really soccer. Why most of us thought that was preposterous. Football is Unitas, Elway, Montana, Kapernick, Manzell; not a person named Ronaldo, who I thought was the McDonald's clown. Still Grant had some good questions for his hefty table fines, but mainly failed to receive good answers. We did not know that 270 million people play soccer. Nor did we know that Brazil the host country had won 5 World Cups, Italy had 4 and Germany had 3. This guy Ronaldo was number 2 on the Forbes athletes list of highest earnings with 80 million dollars, so maybe we should pay attention to this football/soccer thing.

Larry Wallerstein had the foresight to invite newly elected Sheriff Jim Hart to be the guest speaker before he won his election. Jim Hart started by, "thanking Rotary for what you do." He then thanked

Wally Walker for his work as Sheriff. Then shifted to being a "novice politician" and not realizing how much work and money was involved in running a campaign. He depended upon the deputy sheriffs and police who through their support behind his campaign to reach out to 30,000 voters who regularly voted at election time. His office covers 420 square miles and 150,000 people. During his rein he wants to hire more people for his department. Out of 300 people who may apply for jobs only 3-5% are hired. He wants to start a "sobering center" where officers can take people. 40% of the jail is filled with public intoxication issues. 70 inmates are mentally ill. All this takes away from their time. They are two thirds moved in to their new building that they purchased with redevelopment money. It used to take 4-5 stops to collect all the evidence that they needed for a case but now everything is under one roof. The prison realignment has created drug dealers and property crime inmates to be out of jail with electronic monitoring devices attached to them, so they can house people in jail for up to 12 years instead of only 1 year as it was before the reform. They now have a full time doctor and \$750,000 in maintance costs. At the end of his speech he received a McKenzie chocolate handcuff and badge. He might have preferred one of the 100-pound Halibuts that Ian caught in Alaska.
