

## Last Week's Meeting

The Elk's Club arena was packed. A long line of Rotarians and guests were waiting to find their seats, as they went through Larry Fogelquist's security check. Pregame it was

a Warriors crowd. By the time I got to my seat it looked like I attending an estate was planning meeting for I was surrounded by an insurance advisor, legal opinion experts and a memorial advisor, as Aleene Althouse, Thornton Kontz, Bob Bosso and Janet Krassow were my tablemates. Thank God Linda Burroughs was playing comforting Beatles tunes. By the time Carol Lezin offered her thoughtful invocation we were well into the first quarter.

Point guard Burt Rees launched a midcourt shot that took up most of the first quarter getting to the basket with a lengthy reflection on 1959, the year UC Berkeley beat West Virginia in the NCAA basketball title game. His tale rattled the basket before finally falling in when he told our Speaker, Jerry West, that he would pony up a dollar a point that CAL scored that night which amounted to \$71. Jerry then had an easy layup offering to pay \$73 so West Virginia could finally beat CAL in fund raising. Burt had more shots to take but no one would throw him the ball again.

JW started the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter with a full court press of information.

He looked like he could still walk out on the court and beat any Rotarian in the room, except of course Dan Aldrich. His 1st shot was about the D league and how great it was that Santa Cruz had embraced the Warriors, that community kids were involved and that local high schools and colleges used the arena. This Scandinavian designed arena exceeded costs, but Santa Cruz is the league leader in attendance and revenue. Some teams only have 50-75 fans for a home game. A top shelf D league player makes about \$35000. The NBA Warriors can only protect 3 D league players from being taken by another team. Moving on to the European leagues, Spain produced the best players. They are well paid with car, housing and tax perks. Yugoslavia used to produce the best players from their basketball schools, where the average height was 6'6". Israel now has the most rabid fans.

Comfortably ahead by the start of the third quarter he dribbled around personal topics. Growing up he lived in a town of 500 and was a shy, small town boy, so he went to nearby West Virginia for college. "My Rome 1960 Olympic gold medal was my

biggest thrill. I had the best college players as teammates." He took a few shots at his past and grew melancholy as he reminisced about his abusive father. It made him stronger as a person, because he vowed to never be like his father. He choked up when he thought about his religious brother who died flying in the Korean War and never got to see him play basketball. "When I was on the court I hated everybody, but off the court I believed in being humble." His eyes moistened as he reflected on some personal notes he had sent to kids that brought hope and meaning into their lives. "It's not about taking, but about giving back that is important. Here I am a 75-year-old man doing what I want to be doing. I love my job, can't image myself retired. I will go to my grave before I retire. I like the fact that I can be me being me and get paid for it." His shot making was on the mark for 3 quarters but his 4th quarter never started as CEO/GM/Coach Frank called him back to the bench after 45 minutes, as he walked off the court to a standing ovation. That day there may have been taller players in the arena, but none stood taller then Jerry.
