Previously, Nina worked as an independent consultant and exhibition designer with over one hundred museums and cultural centers around the world. Nina began her museum career as Experience Development Specialist at the International Spy Museum in Washington, D.C.!

Michael and Hank confused the crowd with the introduction for God Bless America. It was not their fault that we forgot the first few words to the song, but in the end it sounded wonderful.

The editor wishes to express his apology for forgetting all the guests who were introduced, but worth mentioning, were Edie Rittenhouse, who has been married to Ritt for 53 vears; and **Constantine**'s wife. **Ariana**. The importance of *their* presence became apparent after our guest speaker, Traci Bliss noted that her aunt was a prior owner of Constantine's Beach Hill B&B. Last week 's winning number was 8412. (The winning number is getting smaller, each week.) Burt's quest, Holly, friend of the state parks, WON. **Aleene** announced the B&G Q3 budget approved and includes \$4500 to several programs, including the symphony and a young writers' program. Tom Foster was the detective, and threw out a few pitches to friends and past board

members, and he paid many of their fines. **Peter Cook** turned 41, and his wife **Christy** was in the longboard finals. Another Traci connection: her father, **Dr Barry Bliss** 'brought' **John Brokaw** to Santa Cruz.

Program: Traci Bliss, a fifth generation Santa Cruz'n, researched history to pull together the information that ties her family history to the history of our Redwood parks. Beginning with Aunt Jennie Bliss who came to Santa Cruz in 1879, as an artist, activist, who organized protests to draw attention to the redwoods. Into the story marches **Will Jeter**, district attorney, first democrat mayor in Santa Cruz, lieutenant governor, and publicist for the redwood cause, and husband to Aunt Jennie. Jennie's brother and Traci's grandfather, **Frank Bliss**, celebrated a benefactor of the SC library, **Andrew Carnegie**, at Welch's (redwood) Grove. Will Jeter, SC Co Bank president, chartered SC Rotary club in 1922. At the Int'l Convention held in Los Angeles, Jeter invited the

convention to Santa Cruz to visit Big Trees. We are looking for Paul Harris and other photos at the redwood grove. And there was a dedication of a Rotary Tree, and that tree may be identified again, with Traci's ongoing research. 1928 may have been a poor time to begin fundraising, but SC Rotary began the pitch to save the trees, and buy Welch's Grove. On Jeter's deathbed, he encouraged his friends to not give up the efforts. In 1930, Welch's Grove became a permanent County Park. In the 1950's Henry Cowell's 1700 acres were added to the park, and the Cowell name was attached to the park. (Editing is not my career by choice, and errors abound, but let me say that Traci's presentation, being personally touching, factually impressive, brilliantly delivered, became a favorite presentation for me.
