

Tom Foster gave everyone an envelope. One of those envelopes contained \$100. Steve then proceeded to pull an envelope out of his jacket. He announced that he had never opened his envelope and today he would reveal the contents. We were holding our breath. He carefully opened the envelope to reveal five \$20 bills. Steve announced that he would be donating the money. We applauded him. Tom Foster stood up and explained the true magic of Steve's act. Tom told us that he had originally put in one \$100 bill. Steve turned one bill into five \$20 bills. Steve embodies the magic of Rotary.

Program: Today's program was provided by Bill Richter. He was here to tell us about the Santa Cruz Shakespeare Festival. He told us of a program that joined the community. Many families have grown up in the grass while enjoying the presentations of the festival. The festival fell on hard times and the University wanted to shut it down. This was a true tragedy as this festival had been around for 30 years. The final presentation was on August 2013. That is when Bill stepped in. He joined the board and began to analyze the business of having a festival. His main goal was to be fiscally responsible and perhaps even profitable. He found that the festival generated north of \$17 million. However much of the revenue was miss-classified and given to other departments within the university. The art school that was

responsible for the festival was only credited \$2 million for the event however the whole cost of \$17 million was also attributed to art school. So the university did not feel that the festival should continue. When Bill discovered the error he convinced the university to give them another shot. The University agreed on the basis that the festival would pay for itself. Bill and his Board of Directors decided to hold a variety of fundraisers designed to raise enough capital to pay for the event in advance. This idea of raising capital to pay for the event instead of relying on ticket sales to repay prior costs is unique in the space. His team's ideas are now considered groundbreaking and are being adopted nationwide. Santa Cruz continues to place itself on the map with a variety of ingenious ideas. Rotary continues to provide a forum for us to learn about the magic in our community.
