

I'm not sure what happened next. Anyway we were singing the welcome song and then Sam Bishop won a raffle prize. Ian Mackenzie provided the gift, which looked really great. It was a basket with wine and chocolate and stuff. Sam wouldn't let me get near it (smart guy that Sam).

Jim Bargetto served as detective and he proceeded to badger, hound, cajole, plead and guilt money out of folks. I was a victim of Jim to the tune of \$20; so someone will have to pay! Actually, I sort of hurt myself by insulting the detective (I'm not a very smart man).

Our speaker was Eric Stanfield, CEO of Rope Partner. He is an excellent speaker and produced some amazing images of his professional crew at work on wind turbines. His company can deploy people pretty much anywhere in the country on short notice to keep these huge windmill blades turning. The company grew out of a passion for rock climbing and outdoor adventuring. As with most upstart companies, they started in a garage and have grown to occupy a much

larger warehouse space on the Westside of Santa Cruz. Eric indicated there are something like 45,000 wind turbines in America and they last about 20 years. Like any machine with moving parts, they need maintenance and repair. The largest of the turbines are over 150 meters in diameter (yeah, that's right a football field and a half plus). Rope Partner technicians must meet certification status for ropes. I'm not exactly sure what that means other than they don't just let anyone out on a rope to work hundreds of feet up above the ground.
