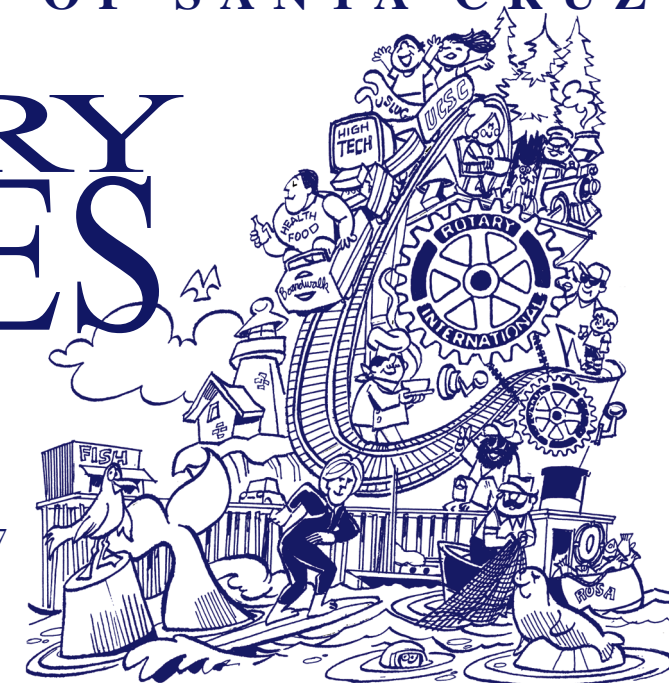

May 25th Meeting Recap

INVOCATION: Tom Foster shared the tidbits found in “An Old Farmer’s Advice,” including, “You cannot unsay a cruel word,” “The best sermons are lived, not preached,” and, “Meanness don’t jes’ happen overnight.” “Don’t judge folks by their relatives,” brought the house down.

CLUB DRAWING: Initial winner Burt Reese turned it down as he won the last time. He may have regretted it when winner Richard Beach reported the donation from Ian Mackenzie is a basket of “The World’s Best Chocolate.”

DETECTIVE REPORT: Rotary Roundup Host Wes Walker fined Tom Parker for being the worst dressed of the 255 attendees, while best-dressed awards went to the Spaghetti Western and Cowboys and Indians garb. Chris Murphy got special mention for wearing leather chaps.



Wes reported on the event’s success, noting that 23 silent auction items grossed \$9,600, while 11 live auction items brought in \$40,500 and, most notable of all, the Fund-A-Need for CASA brought in \$32,750 which CASA is committed to doubling.

The Grand Total was \$180,692.84 with \$65,500 going to CASA and the remaining \$115,192.84 going to the causes and programs supported by Santa Cruz Rotary Club.

The Slatter Bar served 836 cocktails, 400 glasses of wine and 200 beers adding up to \$5,858.68

Chie Kawahara *Build Your House for the Long Term*

Once built, houses last a long time and do not change very much unless a radical transformation is undertaken. As a result, more than half of the 80 million US houses are over 30 years old, very inefficient in energy and water use, and do not provide healthy living conditions.



Chie Kawahara and her husband bought a run-down house on the West Side in 2008, determined to transform it into an efficient, healthy home they named Midori Haus. It was a great candidate for overhaul with little or no insulation, rusted pipes, rod-and-tube wiring, and termite and drainage damage.

But, it had good bones, so, the couple set out to transform the house using the Passive House standard which turns the structure into a virtual furnace. Energy was first on the list so, after gutting the house, its walls, ceiling, and floor were insulated, triple-pane glass windows installed, and air leaks detected and corrected. A Heat Recovery

Ventilator was installed to recycle air and conserve heat.

Mold and other infestations, and termite and weather damage, were corrected, and new wiring and plumbing was installed. The plumbing system uses thin pipes to more quickly deliver hot water to showers. In addition, a 5,000-gallon rainwater catchment was installed to supply water for toilets and cold-water laundry.

The benefits of this approach to home design go beyond efficiency. The house is quieter and cleaner than ordinary houses. It stays warmer in winter and cooler in summer, and of course the PG&E bill is lower.
