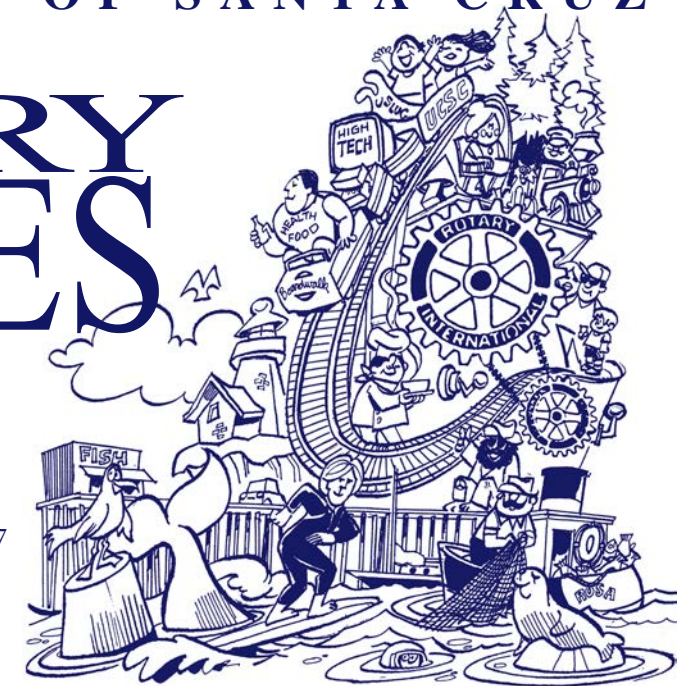

Last Week's Program – Professor David Haussler's Odyssey into the Human Genome



Professor David Haussler did a fantastic job of taking an insanely complex topic and distilling it into something we could all understand.

Our genomes were inherited across 3.8 billion years, and back in the early part of this century, Professor Haussler and his team were in a race to map the first human genome. The race would have important implications on the immediate future of genomics, and it was between the public effort, the International Human Genome Project and the private effort, Celera Corp.

Last Week's Program – Professor David Haussler's Odyssey into the Human Genome (Continued)

Professor Haussler and his team, on the side of the public effort, were "out-gunned" in terms of computer processing power in order to map the 3-billion pieces of the human genome.

Jim Kent was the computer programmer that made the public effort a feasible one. He coded almost non-stop to map the genome before the Celera Corp. In the end, the public effort beat Celera Corp. to map the genome by just three days. On July 7, 2000, the human genome sequence was first posted on the internet.

Today, UCSC has a genome browser that gets approximately 1.2 million page-hits per day. The main challenge today is navigating the difficult regulatory environment as well as privacy concerns so that more institutions share genomic data with one another, allowing further advances in medicine and genomics.
