Last Week’s Program: Soquel Creek Water District

Ron and Melanie came and provided an informative presentation on the Pure Water Soquel Groundwater Replenishment Project. The District runs from 41st Ave to La Selva Beach and relies purely on ground water, as opposed to surface water.

The replenishment project is especially important because of the seawater intrusion that is invading the inland wells. The mission of the project is to provide fresh, clean, reliable water. The District is evaluating four different supply options to replenish the underground water. The four options include: 1) advanced purification, 2) river water transfers, 3) deep water desalination, and 4) storm water capture. Advanced purification is the preferred method because it is the most reliable and sustainable method. This can be achieved through various technologies, but most include three processes. Those three processes are microfiltration, reverse

osmosis, and ultraviolet light / advanced oxidation.
