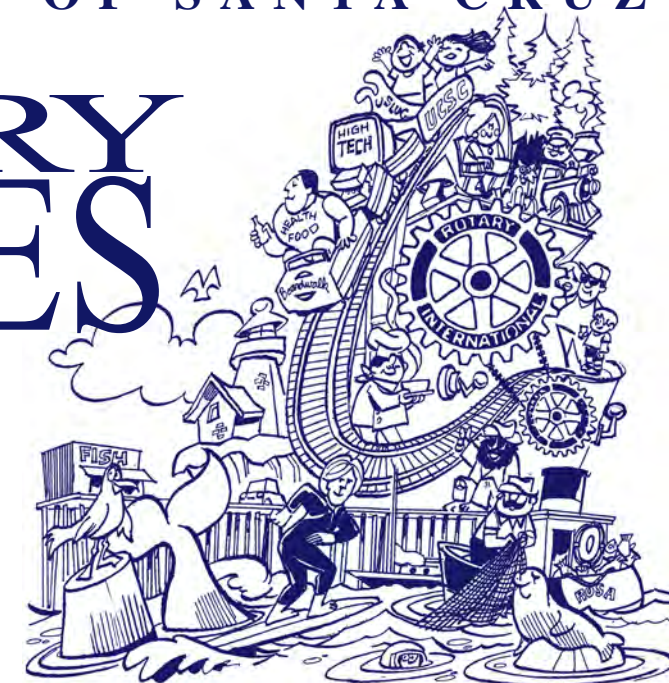

Six teenagers competed in the Annual Rotary Speech Contest directed by Bob Bosso. Five from Harbor High School, and one from Pacific Collegiate School gave speeches about inspiration.

Wendy Sanchez (Harbor) said that we all want to achieve the American dream, and we can if we work together. "We have to not care about background, or race, we just have to share our goals to inspire each other," she said. Her education helped her find out who she really is, and her friends and family have inspired her to achieve. "They give me different perspectives that help me understand my role," she said.

Contest winner **Terry Cole** (PCH) talked about being inspired by Apple founder Steve Jobs to really be something and do something. "Watching Jobs unveil new products gave me a feeling of happiness and hope," said Terry, who eschews Chuck Close's taunt that "inspiration is for amateurs." He said Martin Luther King inspired a hopeful future, while Jobs showed that change requires us all to be inspired."

Cristina Vargas (Harbor) said that finding inspiration as a woman of color is difficult, saying, "There is a lack of such women in fields I want to pursue." She is inspired by

that to press forward, "I'm a woman of color and for me it is going to get better."

Maria Garcia (Harbor) spoke about being blessed but having an inner voice that tells her she is not good enough. "I thought I knew everything about being a person of color, but how could I?"

She said everyone has the same foundation and we need to appreciate what each other has. "Martin Luther King said, 'I have a dream,' but in fact the dream had him."

Fernanda Torres-Calderon (Harbor) grew up in Mexico. "Everybody there was going nowhere, so we moved to California," she said, "but people here weren't going anywhere either because this is real life and you have to work hard."

"I am inspired to work hard now," she said, "so I can be successful and not have to work so hard in the future."

Maya Angelou inspired **Daniela Diaz** (Harbor) by writing about the virtue of courage, inspiring her to value family and education above everything else. "Watching my cousins graduate from college was a new experience in my family," she said, "that inspired me to push forward with my education and do the same thing."
